The London Underground is a system of electric trains which are in London, United Kingdom. It is the oldest underground railway in the world. It started running in 1863 as the Metropolitan Railway. After the opening, the system was copied in many other cities, for example, New York and Madrid. Even though it is called the Underground, about half of it is above the ground. The "Tube" is a slang name for the London Underground because the tunnels for some of the lines are round tubes running through the ground. The Underground serves 270 stations and over 408 kilometres of track. Fourteen stations are outside of London. Over 1 billion passengers use the underground. The escalators in the London Underground system are some of the longest in Europe. They run 20 hours a day, 364 days a year and are used by 13,000 people per hour, with 95% of them running at one time. Underground train systems in other cities may be called metros or subways. Subway is also used across Britain to refer to underground walkways.

- You are going to give a talk about presents. You will have to start in 1.5 minutes and speak for not more than 2 minutes (10-12 sentences).

Remember to say:

- if you like to give and get presents, and why
- what the best present you have ever got was
- if the price of a present is important, and why
- what your attitude to handmade presents is
